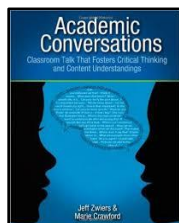

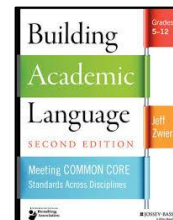

Powering Up Language and Literacy Through Constructive Conversations for All: K-12 with author Jeff Zwiers

All students need to develop skills for engaging in face-to-face conversations in school about academic content. They need skills of clarifying, supporting, and arguing ideas with others. This presentation will focus on improving teacher practices for developing oral language and conversation skills for and through the teaching of content and literacy. Participants will engage in activities and learn classroom-ready strategies to improve students' speaking and paired conversations that are focused on text-based understandings and critical thinking.



Jeff Zwiers teaches at Stanford University's Center to Support Excellence in Teaching. His work focuses on the literacy development of students from diverse cultural and linguistic backgrounds. He offers practical, research-based strategies to teach effective communication and academic language skills across the content areas in K-12 classrooms. Jeff is the author of: *Academic Conversations*; *Building Academic Language*; and *Common Core Standards in Diverse Classrooms*.



Saturday, February 3rd

Sixteen small group sessions in four concurrent strands: **K-5; 6-12; STEAM; and Struggling Readers.**

Educators from across the region will share practical instructional strategies based on current research. These literacy leaders include classroom teachers, instructional specialists, and university faculty.
